ELEMENTARY SCHOOL: PRIMARY

GRADE 1

- Use a combination of words, visuals, and sounds to convey ideas and feelings
- Create phrases and words
- Formation of letters; Sound/symbol connections
- Early reading and writing practices

GRADE 2

- Knowledge of a wider range of materials, including letters from friends, narratives, factual descriptions, folktales, instructions, plays, movies, and tv programs
- Write phrases, clauses, and short paragraphs
- Expand oral vocabulary to speak more fluently and with more confidence
- Independent practice using communication and writing abilities for audiences
- Ability to maintain attention in and derive meaning from lengthy texts
- Fairy tales or folktales from different cultures

GRADE 3

- Revise, polish, and produce their writing
- Speaking formally and informally to convey thoughts and facts that are getting more complex
- The use of organizational tools, including chapter titles, glossaries, indexes, and diagrams
- More complex or metaphorical themes in writing

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL: JUNIOR

GRADE 4

- Searching for definitions on the Internet, in dictionaries, and a thesaurus
- Transitional phrases and words to connect sentences and/or paragraphs and improve writing flow
- The use of root words, suffixes, prefixes, and sentences
- Read a range of works from other cultures, such as literary works such as myths, dramas, poetry, short stories, chapter books, and letters
- Recognize the functions of listening in formal and informal contexts
- Learn to recognize and investigate various points of view in the literature

GRADE 5

- The use of comparison adjectives such as bigger, more, and expensive
- Using the right elements of speech to convey the intended meaning clearly
- Learning the proper use of commas, question marks, exclamation points, and other punctuation
- Basic use of words, prefixes, and suffixes

GRADE 6

- Cursive writing and printing
- Organization of phrases, clauses, and basic sentences
- Use a variety of forms to create larger, more in-depth texts such as significant roles of a historical or modern figure according to research

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL: INTERMEDIATE

GRADE 7

- Use different connecting and/or introducing words and phrases to give the writing structure through varying sentence structures. This includes words/phrases such as however, for example, therefore, as a result
- Word order, grammatical patterns, and punctuation are examples of syntactic (language structure) signals.
- Different writing styles such as symbolism, metaphor, and foreshadowing
- Students can breakdown the meaning of poems, novels, mysteries, historical fiction, autobiographies, scripts, songs, visual texts, and instructional texts

GRADE 8

- Rhetorical techniques and figurative language
- Syntactic (language structure) signals, such as word order and how words relate to one another, grammatical patterns, and punctuation
- Words, phrases, sentences, and images that use prefixes, suffixes, and prior knowledge of the spoken and written language
- The understanding of arguments and understanding both sides of an issue

SECONDARY SCHOOL

PRESENTATION SKILLS FOR ALL HIGH SCHOOL GRADES

- The choice and application of visual and technical aids to strengthen presentations' messages
- The planning and practice of presentations for a range of audiences and reasons
- Concentrate on studying and analyzing the elements of persuasive speeches, their traits, and the speaking styles of effective orators
- Reports, speeches, debates, panel discussions, storytelling, recitations, interviews, and multimedia presentations are among the formats that can be used
- This course has a strong emphasis on the information and abilities needed to organize, make, and talk persuasively in both official and informal settings.
